### **November Update**

After completing a risk assessment it is necessary for the Hedgehog class to go home at 12noon on Wednesday 15th November (no meals served) and for the school to **close to all children on Thursday 16th** November. #### World Nursery Rhyme Week

We are taking part in World Nursery Rhyme week from 13th - 17th November. You can find out more about it on the website <u>www.worldnurseryrhymeweek.com</u> along with videos and resources for each of the specific rhymes. This year the key rhymes are: Monday- Jack and Jill

- Tuesday Hickory Hickory Dock Wednesday - Heads Shoulders Knees and Toes Thursday - Row Row Row your Boat
- Friday The Wheels on the Bus

Nursery Rhymes are really important for children's development. Please make sure you sing some every day with your child.



## **Calpol & Medication**

If your child is unwell and needs to have Calpol or other similar medicine before coming to school, please let them stay at home. Children who are unwell are much better off at home where they can rest and recuperate instead of sitting in a busy classroom when they feel unwell. We ask that unwell children stay at home until they are better and are fully able to participate in all the areas of Nursery School again, for cases of vomiting/ diarrhoea / fever children should be 48 hours clear before they return. This also helps prevent any illnesses spreading through the class.

## **Getting Ready to Learn**

We are part of the Getting Ready to Learn Programme run by the Department of Education. We receive a small amount of funding each year to buy resources to lend to parents to help them support their child's learning at home. The first set of lending resources will be going home this half term. Book Bags contain three different books - usually from different genres but on a theme e.g. dinosaurs. Please look after these book bags and the books inside them as they are lent out to other families after you return them. Read the stories with your child, talk about the pictures and stories, maybe sing a song that goes along with them if you know one. Book Bags must be returned promptly on their due date so that we can lend them out to another family the following week.

#### SCHOOL PHOTO DAY – WEDNESDAY 22ND NOV

The School Photographer will be in school on Wed 22nd November to take individual children's photos. Around a week later a proof pack will be sent home with your child. You can choose to pay for and keep the approval pack or return it unopened. Payments should be made through school money. This will go live when the packs go home. If you choose to also buy the digital copies please let us know your correct email address and we will pass this on the photographer. It is also possible to order additional packs for Christmas gifts.

# **Snack and Activity Fund**

Our Snack and Activity Fund is vital for us to be able to provide the daily Healthy Snack for the children, as well as all the enrichment experiences throughout the year. These are not funded by the school's budget, which only covers staff costs and utilities for the building. The enrichment fund also is used for paper, paint, glue, craft materials, dough and baking ingredients for activities with the children.

This month we have a number of Enrichment activities taking place : Jump Jiggle and Jive will be taking movement sessions for the classes every Wednesday, World of Owls has already visited on 7th November and the Banyan Theatre Company will be visiting with their show The Gingerbread Man on 28th November.

These activities are covered in part by the Snack/Activity fund and then subsidised by the school. We ask for £20 per month for the snack/enrichment fund as the total costs for the visitors are split over the whole year. We do not like to ask for individual payments for activities to allow parents to budget rather than pay for multiple activities/events in one month.

The snack/enrichment fund is a voluntary contribution to the school, as explained at the start of the year, but we cannot afford to bring all the visitors in to school without this fund. Parents who do not pay the Snack/Activity Fund may be asked to make individual contributions for each enrichment activity e.g. this month would be £6.50 for Jump Jiggle and Jive, £5 for Banyan Theatre Company, £5 for World of Owls.

Thank you to any parents who have already paid their Snack/Activity Fund for the year/term and for those who have kept up to date with them. Miss Algie office can help with any questions about School Money. If you would prefer to pay snack/ enrichment fund in cash please speak to your child's teacher.

If your financial situation has changed or you are finding things difficult please speak to Miss Algie in confidence as we do not want the Snack/Enrichment Fund
